Dear Mr. Dwyer,

Thank you for sending us the letter from CIRNAC containing their review comments on the completeness of the water licence amendment application filed by Canzinc Mines Ltd. on 20 June 2019. In their letter, CIRNAC requests that:

1. Canzinc provide documentation to confirm that the treated soils met the established Tier 3 Soil Quality Remediation Objectives treatment objectives.
2. CIRNAC also requests details on the final handling of the soil to confirm if and how the soils were reused or disposed.

The remediation of petroleum hydrocarbon contaminated soil at the former Nanisivik bulk fuel storage facility was overseen by Canzinc's environmental consultant, SRK. The remediation work was documented in annual "Contaminated Soil Remediation Progress Reports" prepared by SRK. The reports provide information on the matters discussed in CIRNAC's completeness review comments, including the soil quality remediation objectives (SQROs) applied during the soil remediation, soil sampling and treatment methodologies, the chemical analyses completed to confirm remediated areas and treated soil met the established SQROs, and handling of soil that had been treated to meet the SQROs. It is our view that the information presented in these reports addresses the requests made by CIRNAC in their completeness review. The Contaminated Soil Remediation Progress Reports have been submitted to the NWB as part of the annual reports for water licence 1AR-NAN1419 and can be accessed via the Board's Public Registry. If more convenient for CIRNAC and so requested, we would be pleased to also email the reports directly to the CIRNAC representatives reviewing Canzinc's water licence amendment application.

We trust that this response meets your needs but please do not hesitate to contact me should additional information be required.
