<p><u>Background</u></p> <p>Water discharge and waste disposal activities took place in August 2010 by Mosher Construction as part of the Hydrometric Testing of the Rankin Inlet Fuel Storage Facility. Approximately 3064m³ of salt water was used from Hudson Bay to check the integrity of six tanks. A water sample was taken by the Licensee from the tanks before discharge and the Licensee was given approval to discharge by the Nunavut Water Board (NWB).</p> <p><u>Inspectors Statement</u></p> <p>On July 4 2014 a water licence inspection was conducted at the Rankin Inlet tank farm. Since all water use and waste disposal activities associated with this licence have ceased and the licence is expired, the inspection was focused on determining whether all relevant terms and conditions of the NWB Licence No. 1BH-RFS0910 were met prior to the expiration of the licence.</p> <p><u>Observations on Site</u></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. An inspection of the effluent discharge location was conducted to determine if the activity was effectively remediated. Photos taken by the Licensee of the effluent discharge activity and observations from this on-site inspection confirm that the licensee has completed all restoration work as required by the water licence. 2. The licensee has indicated through correspondences that the sludge was put in the sludge tank at the fuel storage facility.
