The Government of Nunavut (CLEY) has reviewed the material for the amended application of Defence Construction Canada to use water and waste disposal water associated with a changed water source.

The department does not object to the application. However, there are two archaeological sites within 500 metres of the proposed amended water source. The two sites are very close to roads leading up to the amended water source. The proponent must appreciate that it is their responsibility to ensure that no palaeontological or archaeological sites are disturbed in the course of their activities.

All archaeological and palaeontological sites in Nunavut are protected by law. Should any site be encountered, the proponent must contact the Department of Culture, Language, Elders and Youth.
