Technical Review Memorandum

Re: 1BR-CLI0914 – Long-Term Monitoring Plan – Clifton Point (PIN – B) – Contaminated Sites – Aboriginal Affairs and Northern Development Canada (AANDC).

Background

Clifton Point (Pin-B) is a former Distant Early Warning (DEW) radar site. It is located on the coast of the Amundsen Gulf in Nunavut. The closest communities are Paulatuk, in the Northwest Territories, 220km to the Northwest and Kugluktuk, in Nunavut, 220km to the Southeast.

The Clifton Point (Pin-B) Dew line site was abandoned in 1963 and subsequently in 1965 the site reverted back to AANDC formerly Indian and Northern Affairs Canada (INAC).

Over the years a number of site visits were conducted, however, in 2007 a final site assessment was completed and in 2009 a contract to clean-up the site was awarded. The site clean-up commenced in 2009 and was completed in the summer of 2010.

Recommendations/Comments

After reviewing the Long-Term Monitoring Plan for Clifton Point (Pin B), AANDC is satisfied that the plan meets the requirements of Part K Item 1 of the Water License 1BR-CLI0914.

AANDC recommends that due to the nature of the activity (i.e. long term monitoring) the proponent be granted a renewal licence for 25 years (the longevity of the proposed Long-Term Monitoring Plan).
