RE <u>Approval of "PIN-B (Clifton Point) Long Term Monitoring Plan, Required Under Part K, Item 1, of</u> Licence 1BR-CL10914

Dear Mr. Spagnuolo:

The Nunavut Water Board (NWB or Board) received from Indian and Northern Affairs Canada (INAC) - Contaminated Sites, on April 11, 2011, the Plan entitled "PIN-B (Clifton Point) Long Term Monitoring Plan", dated April 15, 2011. Following receipt, the NWB conducted a preliminary review and, on April 18, 2011, distributed the document publicly to interested parties for a thirty-day (30) comment and or review period. Submissions¹, which included general recommendations, were received from three intervening parties: Aboriginal Affairs and Northern Development Canada (AANDC), Environment Canada (EC), and the Kitikmeot Inuit Association (KIA).

The NWB's comprehensive review of the Plan, which took into consideration interveners comments, determined that the document is consistent with the requirements under Part K, Item 1 in Licence 1BR-CLI0914. The Board has, therefore, approved the Plan under Motion Number: 2011-15-L02.

To ensure that the Plan addresses all issues raised by intervening parties during the public review, the Board advises that the Licensee include all changes made to the Plan in the form of an addendum and submit together with the 2011 Annual Report.
