A. BACKGROUND

On July 4, 2018 the Nunavut Water Board (NWB or Board) provided notification to interested parties that Crown Indigenous Relations and Northern Affairs Canada – Contaminated Sites Division (Licensee) had submitted a Cancellation licence for their Type "B" water licence # 1BR-CLR1419 for the Contwoyto Lake Former weather station Site Remediation Project.

The Contwoyto Lake, former Weather Station Remediation Project is located on an unnamed island on Crown land approximately 190 Km southwest of Bathurst Inlet, Nunavut.

The Contwoyto Lake Weather Station was originally built in 1956 and operated by Pacific Western Airlines until 1978 when Transport Canada took over the site to build a navigational aid station. Transport Canada later abandoned the site and the Kugluktuk Hunters and Trappers Organization took over in 1984, using the buildings as an outpost camp. The Lands and Contaminated Sites Directorate of INAC recommended site clean-up in the 1990s and in 2013 a Remedial Action Plan was created to deal with discarded fuel drums, petroleum hydrocarbon contaminated soil and both hazardous and non-hazardous debris. Remediation activities occurred in the summer of 2014, with final demobilization of equipment in 2015. The Licensee submitted a Final Remediation Report to the NWB in 2016.

B. RESULTS OF REVIEW

On behalf of Crown-Indigenous Relations and Northern Affairs Canada – Water Resources, the following comments and recommendations are provided for the Board's consideration.

After reviewing a letter dated June 23, 2017 regarding details of remediation of activities and the results of the confirmatory sampling that occurred on site March 2016 findings of the report indicated

- All non-hazardous and hazardous debris was containerized and transported off-site for disposal.
- All metals-impacted soil was containerized and transported off-site for disposal.
- The analytical results for confirmatory soil samples collected from the former areas of metal and petroleum hydrocarbon impact met the applicable environmental quality guidelines.
- Petroleum hydrocarbon impacted soil was treated on-site to within applicable environmental quality guidelines.
- Soil samples collected from the base of the land farm soil treatment area did not identify any detectable concentrations of petroleum hydrocarbons that would suggest that any migration of hydrocarbons occurred from the land farm during the course of the project.
- No further remediation work remains to be completed on site.

Water Licence Final inspection report dated July 10, 2017

Section 1

A CIRNAC Water Resources Officer conducted a final inspection of the Contwoyto Lake Weather Station Cleanup conducted by INAC Contaminated Sites Program (NU) on July 10, 2017. The officer indicated that the remediation for the project has been completed and all equipment removed. The site is well contoured with no signs of ponding in the excavated areas. The officer stated that "Authorizing bodies may close/cancel this file at their discretion".

Crown-Indigenous Relations and Northern Affairs Canada Water Source Division has no major concerns or comments for this file and recommends cancellation since all requirements have been met.
