## Existing Water Licence # 1BR-EKA0809

## **Background Information:**

FOX-C DEW Line Site was constructed in 1957 and abandoned in 1963. Indian and Northern Affairs Canada implemented a Remedial Action Plan in 2005 and the demobilization of equipment and materials from the site occurred in September 2008.

Work being done on the Non-Hazardous Waste Landfill (NHWL) was finalized in September 2008; the NHWL is the only remaining structure on site.

The purpose of the renewal application is for long-term monitoring (25 years, with the potential for further monitoring) of the NHWL.

## **Recommendations / Comments**

Should the NWB approve the long term monitoring plan, INAC has no concerns with a renewal of this licence.

Given the nature of this renewal (short duration of site visits, water withdraw for sampling purposes only, no waste disposal on site), INAC would like to recommend a renewal of this licence for the maximum term issuable as per the Nunavut Waters and Nunavut Surface Rights Tribunal Act, of 25 years. The standard terms and conditions relating to the submission of annual reports and monitoring/sampling results should continue to apply.
