Indigenous and Northern Affairs Canada (INAC) Contaminated Sites Program currently holds a water licence to conduct remediation and monitoring activities at Ennadai Lake, located 380 km west of Arviat, NU. Remediation at this site was completed in 2015 and a 25-year long term monitoring program was initiated in 2016. INAC is submitting an application to amend water licence 1BR-ELR1419 to reduce the scope of work from remediation to monitoring activities.
