RE: Project Summary for Water Use License Application NWB5FOX

UMA Engineering Ltd. is providing the following project summary, as per the request of the Nunavut Water Board, on behalf of Defence Construction Canada and the Department of National Defence. The project summary is required in both English and Inuktitut to continue the application processing.

The work to be completed at FOX-4, Cape Hooper involves the repackaging of materials coated with PCB Amended Paint (PAP) currently in a registered, Environment Canada Temporary PCB Storage Area. The stored materials require repackaging in order to be in compliance with Transport Canada guidelines, prior to the removal of the containers from the site to a licensed, southern disposal facility. There are three containers in storage at FOX-4 that require repackaging.

In support of the repackaging activities, a small, temporary camp will be set up to accommodate 5-10 people for a duration of one week. In addition, a loader or equivalent piece of machinery will be brought to site to move the storage containers from the storage area to the barge for removal from the site.

As referenced in the application, the full clean up of the FOX-4 site was completed in 1998.
