Hi Sean,

The monitoring program documents do list all of the on-site monitoring wells, at FOX-4 there are 16 wells; the list of analytes are also included in the program documents, this information has been provided to the NWB. The amount of water taken for sampling purposes from each site will vary between monitoring events; depending on whether the monitoring wells contain enough water for a sample. If each monitoring well has water, the maximum amount of water taken for sampling could be 3.5 litres at each of FOX-4's 16 monitoring well locations. Therefore the maximum amount of water that could be taken from FOX-4 for sampling purposes is 56 litres or 0.056 cu. m.

As stated in the previous email, going forward the volume of water taken during a monitoring event will included the annual report submission cover letter.

Hi Tamara

The Nunavut Water Board (NWB or Board) has completed its preliminary review of the above-mentioned application in which it was determined that the following items must be addressed/confirmed before the application could proceed to the next stage of the licensing process:

1. Details on the amount of water required for sampling should be provided. Previously, Aboriginal Affairs and Northern Development Canada's Inspectors did not necessarily consider water use associated with site monitoring activities as active use; however, the Inspectors' approach has changed since the implementation of Nunavut specific Waters Regulations. Water used for monitoring purposes must be included in any licence issued to a project.
