AECOM Canada Ltd. is providing the attached annual report form as per Section B.1 of the abovenoted water use license. The report is being submitted on behalf of Defence Construction Canada and the Department of National Defence.

During the 2013 field season at the FOX-4 Cape Hooper DEW Line Site, construction activities included regrading and decommissioning of the Landfarm, Non-Hazardous Waste Landfill (NHWL), Tier II Disposal Facility, and contaminated soil excavation. The following is a detailed summary of the work items completed during the 2013 summer construction season at FOX-4:

- Landfill regrades were completed at the following locations:
 - Helipad West Landfill
 - o Station Area Landfill
 - o Pallet Line Landfill
 - Heated Vehicle Storage Area
 - o Tanner Bay Landfill
- Landfill excavation work was completed at the following locations:
 - o Helipad Landfill East Landfill
 - o Barrel Dump Landfill
 - Garbage Disposal Landfill
 - o Airstrip Landfill
- General site grading included:
 - The airstrip was repaired and depressions were filled using screened granular fill from Borrow Area 6
 - A washout and other minor erosion features were repaired on the airstrip as required
 - Granular fill was placed and compacted on select areas of the airstrip to provide a more uniformly sloped surface
 - The site access road was stabilized at the end of the season with the placement of additional fill in localized depressions in the vicinity of the Station Area
- Existing Tier II Disposal Facility construction activity:



- An additional 1.5m of Type 2 granular fill was added to the cap to allow for suitable thermal cover
- The sideslopes of the facility were adjusted for the additional cover material existing
 Type 1 Granular Fill was removed and stockpiled for replacement
- Thermistors were extended to account for the additional cap thickness
- Expanded Tier II Disposal Facility construction activity:
 - The bottom liner system, with Type 5 embedment materials, was installed at the beginning of the 2013 construction season and the facility was ready to accept contaminated soils by July 17, 2013
 - Tier II contaminated material was brought to this facility from all of the landfill excavations. The final load occurred on August 23, 2013
 - Capping involved 0.3m Type 2 Granular Fill, liner, Type 5 Granular Fill and a thermal cover of 2.35m Type 2 Granular Fill
 - Four thermistors were installed within this facility
- Non-Hazardous Waste Landfill construction activity:
 - Debris was placed within the Landfill during the 2013 Construction season
 - o Type 6 Granular Fill was added as specified
 - o The landfill was capped with a 1 metre thick cap of Type 2 Granular Fill.
- Landfarm construction activity:
 - Soils requiring treatment were placed in the facility, which included Type B hydrocarbon contaminated soils from the Beach POL
 - Sediment catchment ponds were excavated and periodically dredged
 - Type B contaminated soils were placed and type 1 Granular Fill was used from the treatment soils
 - Decommissioning of the Landfarm involved using the Type 2 Granular Fill to from the construction of the berms for grading the Landfarm
- Thermokarst Remediation:
 - The original thermokarst was backfilled with granular material in an effort to stabilize the erosion feature identified in the previous season
 - o These areas were monitored for evidence of further instability throughout the season

The work remaining in 2014 includes demobilization of the contractors' camp and equipment from the site, as well as removal of the PCB materials currently in storage.

Community Consultations: The results of the community meetings held by DCC were submitted with the Project Description. The contractor typically holds a project start up meeting prior to each season; however, a copy of the presentation has not been provided.



LOCATION OF CAPE HOOPER WITHIN NUNAVUT TERRITORY SCALE NIS

















The following results of the Monitoring Program (MP) and/or Water Use License are provided by the Environmental Sciences Group to meet the requirements of the above-noted license for *FOX-4* (*Cape Hooper*).

1. SEWAGE EFFLUENT

Two sewage lagoons were constructed at FOX-4 in September 2011 and July 2012. The lagoons were constructed a minimum of 100 m from drainage courses and water bodies. Both lagoons were decommissioned in 2013 by flattening the berms and reshaping the area.

The Water Use License and MP require that samples from treated sewage lagoon effluent at the point of discharge to the receiving water be collected prior to each discharge event.

Sampling was not completed at the FOX-4 sewage lagoons during the 2013 field season. The level of liquid in the lagoons remained low and discharge was not required.
