Good day Corinne,

I was doing a preliminary technical review of your application and I noticed that some required documents are not included in the application.

Given the only land-farming activities proposed under this licence , maybe you do not plan to have any hazardous materials stored on site. However, I believe you will have heavy and/or other machinery working on-site. The application should contain a standalone **Spill Contingency Plan** in the format set out by the Consolidation of Spill Contingency Planning and Reporting Regulations R-068-93.

A standalone **Abandonment and Restoration Plan** should also be included with the application. If the remediation will be completed by a contractor and you don't still have a selected contractor, you may submit an Interim Abandonment and Restoration Plan within tentative dates.

A description of undertaking is provided within the Item 9 of licence application. However, a **Project Summary in English** shall be helpful to be included within the application as well.

The licence application shall be sent for 30 day comments upon the receipt of above mentioned documents.
