With the licence having already been issued by the NWB I would suggest contacting INAC and the INAC Inspector on the interpretation and enforceability of matters in relation to 1BR-IAD0606, 1BR-LTU0608, and 8BR-UTI0606. The NWB relies on our INAC brethren on mobilizing to site and interpreting licence conditions with respect to enforceability. Thanks again for the information.

The Licence Kudlik Construction is referring to is No. 1BR-IAD0606. They dropped a copy of the licence off at my office this

morning. It appears from a cursory review of the licence that ED&T do have authority to complete a drainage ditch rehabilitation in the airport area as described in their project drawings. However, there is no indication in the licence that they have been permitted to draw down the level of the pond in the North 40. I anticipate it was indicated in the project drawings however I have not seen them.

I am copying Mr. Andrew Keim, INAC Inspector, on this email. As of 3:00 pm on October 23 Kudlik were advised by the City to stop work until further notice. Given the City has obligations with the GN and INAC through its Quarry Admin Agreement and the City-INAC agreement (no disturbance of standing or ponded water) to allow the N40 to remain open for the 2006 construction season we request clear direction as to permitting or prohibiting this draw down operation.

We do not want to cause delay in the Airport Expansion project however, we are aware of our legal and fiduciary responsibilities with the GN and INAC in this regard.
