Subject: Implementation of mitigation measures to avoid and mitigate serious harm to fish.

The Fisheries Protection Program (the Program) of Fisheries and Oceans Canada received your proposal on July 23, 2014.

Your proposal has been reviewed to determine whether it is likely to result in serious harm to fish which is prohibited under subsection 35(1) of the Fisheries Act.

Our review consisted of: Request for Review: Iqaluit International Airport Improvement Project (IIAIP), Final Report V.1 July 2014 (JFSA P1217).

We understand that you propose to install a 250 meter closed culvert and realign 450 meter of a running ditch at the Iqaluit International Airport.

To avoid the potential of serious harm to fish and their habitat, we are recommending that the attached mitigation measures be included into your plans.

Timing

- No in-water work from September 1 to June 30 of any given year to protect fish, including their eggs, juveniles, spawning adults and/or the organisms upon which they feed.
 - 0 This in-water work timing restriction does not apply if the watercourse is frozen to the bottom.

Erosion and Sediment Control



Develop and implement an Erosion and Sediment Control Plan for the site that
minimizes risk of sedimentation of the waterbody during all phases of the project.
Erosion and sediment control measures should be maintained until all disturbed
ground has been permanently stabilized, suspended sediment has resettled to the
bed of the waterbody or settling basin and runoff water is clear.

Fish Protection

• Ensure that all in-water activities, or associated in-water structures, do not interfere with fish passage, constrict the channel width, or reduce flows.

Provided that these mitigation measures are incorporated into your plans, the Program is of the view that your proposal will not result in serious harm to fish. No formal approval is required from the Program under the *Fisheries Act* in order to proceed with your proposal. Please be aware that a water license may be required and we suggest you contact the Nunavut Water Board.

If your plans have changed or if the description of your proposal is incomplete, or changes in the future, you should consult our website (http://www.dfo-mpo.gc.ca/pnw-ppe/index-eng.html) or consult with a qualified environmental consultant to determine if further review is required by the Program.

Please notify this office at least 10 days before starting your project. A copy of this letter should be kept on site while the work is in progress.
