A. BACKGROUND

On July 29, 2016 the Nunavut Water Board (NWB or Board) provided notification to interested parties that Indigenous and Northern Affairs Canada had submitted a new Type "B" water licence application, # 1BR-KEI----, for the CAM-E Keith Bay site remediation project.

The applicant has submitted a new Type B water licence application for their activities.

The CAM-E site is located in the Kitikmeot Region of Nunavut 75 km east of Kugarruk, the site was used historically as an intermediate DEW line site by the Department of National Defence (DND). It was constructed in 1957 and taken out of service 1963; in 1965 the responsibility of the site was assumed by INAC.

Interested parties were asked to review the water licence cancellation application and provide technical comments by August 29, 2016.

B. RESULTS OF REVIEW

INAC Water Resource Division submits the following comments/recommendations to the Nunavut Water Board for consideration:

1. Fuel and Hazardous Materials Spill Contingency Plan

Section 4.6 Spill Response Actions on Different Media:

On Snow & Ice

 Burn accumulated diesel from the surface using Tiger Torches if feasible and safe to do so.

Recommendation

INAC does not recommend the burning of accumulated fuel, instead INAC recommends that the spill be stopped and contained where the excess fuel can be absorbed by pads or any similar material and disposed of properly.
