**Re: Open Burn Permit Request – FOX-D (Kivitoo) Site Remediation Project  
Nunavut Water Board Licence No. 1BR-KV1621**

Dear Ms. Porter,

The following letter has been prepared to request a Burn Permit for the FOX-D (Kivitoo) Site Remediation Project. The contractor's methodology that will be followed in order to burn the unpainted scrap wood is detailed herein:

To manage potential large volumes of unpainted/untreated wood removed from the numerous landfills at FOX-D, the contractor plans to use the booster tank located at upper site as a burn pit. It is made of galvanized steel and will be cut it in half to make 2 burn pits. One pit will be placed the area of the Lower Site Landfills and the other near the Upper Site Landfill.

If deemed necessary, the contractor will wash the inside with a pressure washer and degreaser before use. All resulting wash water will be treated as process water in the same manner as the water used to wash drums. Prior to using the burn pits, extinguisher training will be provided by the On-site Health and Safety Officer and proper fire response procedures will be reviewed. An extinguisher station will be established at the burn site to allow for rapid fire response. The Hazardous Waste Specialist will oversee burning operations to ensure that only untreated/unpainted wood is burned and that the bins are not overfilled causing them to overflow.

Ash resulting from burning will be collected after each burn cycle and containerized in BWI Bulk Bags. The ash will be analyzed and shipped off-site for disposal.
