Appreciate for your quick catch. Please see the response of your questions:

- water spray is an option only to expedite the remediation process (if needed). Water can be used from the pond using the decanting pump and spray only on laid soil layer which will not require some small quantity in excess of expected rain water.
- The planned O&M manual will cover the Spill response and any related information which will be submitted and will supersede the previous O&M manual.
- The activated carbon water treatment will not be considering at this stage since a natural remediation is the mandate as approved and cost effective slow remediation process.

If there any more information needed, I am happy to provide as available to our end.

Good morning Shah,

Thank you for your prompt response to the comments. I have just a couple more quick questions for you.

The 2017 annual report mentions spraying with water as one of the measures being considered in the landfarm operation. Is there an additional water source required for this activity or do you find runoff water sufficient?

The previous licence lists conditions in Part E, Item 1 and Part H, Item 1 requiring updated O&M and spill plans. We understand that a commitment was made in regards to the submission of the O&M plan update in July 2019 - can the same be applied to the spill plan update?

Is an activated carbon water treatment unit (defined in the previous licence as "Water Treatment Facilities") available and are you looking to keep it included in the licence?
