Water Licence Application

Dear Ms. Beaulieu,

The Department of Lands and Resources within the Qikiqtani Inut Association (QIA) has reviewed the water licence application for the FOX-2 Longstaff Bluff DEW Line Site. In reviewing this application, QIA has made reference to all documents contained in the 1BR-LON0308 file in the Nunavut Water Board's (NWB) FTP-site.

The application submitted by Defense Construction Canada (DCC) is clearly well developed and contains substantial evidence supporting the proposed site remediation plans. QIA also acknowledges that this application is preceded by the DND-NTI Cooperation Agreement (September 1998), which has offered Inuit the opportunity to participate in the planning process for DEW LINE cleanups across Nunavut.

Regarding the current application, QIA requests the NWB require the applicant to submit final design plans for all infrastructure associated with this application. Additionally, final design plans should be stamped and signed by a qualified professional. Furthermore, QIA requests the applicant submit a monitoring plan, marked as final, for review upon completion of site restoration. In the event changes to the project as proposed are necessary, QIA requests the NWB require the applicant to submit updated plans. Finally, the annual report required by the applicant should include a provision requiring the applicant to provide rationale for all project changes.
