In response to CIRNAC's recommendation R-02, please see the attached revised spill contingency plan. Section 3.1 has been updated to indicate that a minimum of two spill kits are required: one shall be stored at the camp/staging area, and one shall be stored with the ATV/truck. In response to CIRNAC's recommendation R-03, DND is in the process of procuring professional services to undertake an assessment of the thermal data collected at the DEW Line sites in Nunavut, including FOX-2. The objective of the study will be to evaluate the thermal equilibrium/stability/performance of the landfills that incorporated permafrost freeze-back in their designs. As this project is still in the procurement stage, there are no results to report at this time. I trust this addresses CIRNAC's review comments.
