Please be advised that under the Agreement Between the Inuit of the Nunavut Settlement Area and Her Majesty the Queen in Right of Canada (Nunavut Agreement) Article 11, Section 11.5.9 and s. 76 (1) of *Nunavut Planning and Project Assessment Act* (NuPPAA), the proponent of a project governed by NuPPAA is also required to submit a project proposal document (which may include the water licence application) directly to the Nunavut Planning Commission (NPC or Commission) for the NPC's determination regarding the applicable land use planning requirements and/or directions regarding whether the project is subject to screening by the Nunavut Impact Review Board. In particular, please note that as established under Articles 11, 12 and 13 of the Nunavut Agreement, NuPPAA and Part 3 of the *Nunavut Waters and Nunavut Surface Rights Tribunal Act*, until the project has completed the applicable land use planning and assessment process required by the NPC, the NWB cannot issue a water licence.

The NWB confirms receipt of NPC conformity under NuPPAA on January 10, 2017. NPC Conformity determination states that the project proposal is exempt from screening by the Nunavut Impact Review Board (NIRB) under section 12.4.3 of the Nunavut Agreement as amended. This application is now ready for review and comments. Deadline for submissions is **February 1, 2017**.
