Hi Rita.

In Part H of the above noted license, it was requested that we prepare an Operation and Maintenance Manual for the Waste Disposal Facilities we are constructing at the site according to the Government of the Northwest Territory's Guidelines for Preparing an Operation and Maintenance Manual for Sewage and Solid Waste Disposal Facilities, dated October 1996.

The landfills at the former Pelly Bay DEW Line site are specifically being constructed for the disposal of demolition debris and contaminated soils from the site. The landfills are not for use by the Municipality for the disposal of domestic waste, although the Contractor may dispose of minimal camp wastes within these landfills (Because work at the DEW Line site was delayed this past summer due to the road construction work, the Contractor used the community of Kugaruuk's water supply and sewage disposal services while on-site). Also, the landfills are to be constructed and closed next year (2002). Because of the short duration the landfills will be open, and that fact the landfills are not for Municipal use, I don't think the Operation and Maintenance Manual Guidelines can accurately be applied to these landfills.

We will provide the Nunavut Water Board with additional information on the construction of the landfills, which will constitute the Abandonment and Restoration Plans required in Part I of the License. We can also provide information on the landfill performance monitoring program which will be conducted for 25 years after construction/closure of the landfills has been completed.

Please advise whether you think this will be acceptable, or whether we will still have to complete an Operation and Maintenance Manual for the landfills.
