Radio Island is located approximately 340 km southeast of the City of Iqaluit, off the Coast of Resolution Island. It is situated at Latitude 61° 18' N and Longitude 64° 52' W. The nearest community is the City of Iqaluit and Hamlet of Kimmirut, located approximately 340km northwest of the site. Radio Island was a former Navigational Aid and Weather Station operational from 1929 until 1961. The remediation of this site is funded under the Federal Contaminated Sites Action Plan (FCSAP).
