Enclosed is your copy of Land Use permit number N2001X0011 authorizing your project as described in your application dated April 4, 2001.

Your application has received a wide distribution to other Federal departments, Government of the NWT departments, communities in the area of your operation and concerned native groups. In distributing your application the Nunavut Impact Review Board (NIRB) sought comments from these various agencies based on their area of expertise that will help ensure minimum negative impact on the environment. The issuance of this permit indicates that as a result of the NIRB environmental screening process it was decided that the potentially adverse environmental effects that may be caused by your proposal are mitigable with known technology and are not significant. The terms and conditions in the permit will, in our opinion, provide the necessary protection to the environment.

The Nunavut Impact Review Board has also recommended the following:

- That you use the latest bear detection and deterrent techniques to minimize man-bear interactions and report any Man-Bear Interactions to the nearest Nunavut Wildlife Officer.
- 2. That aircraft pilots do not disturb wildlife. Raptor nesting sites and concentrations of nesting or molting waterfowl should be avoided by aircraft at all times.
- 3. That you make all efforts to minimize harassment to wildlife including reduction of operation in sensitive areas during critical time periods (denning, nesting stage etc.).

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- That you be aware that harmful alteration, disruption or destruction of fish habitat is prohibited under Section 35 of the Fisheries Act. No construction or disturbance of any stream/lake bed or banks of any definable watercourse is permitted unless authorized by DFO.
- 5. That you ensure that all in stream construction is carried out during the low water period.
- 6. That you follow all terms and conditions for the protection and restoration of archaeological resources as outlined by the Department of Culture, Language, Elders and Youth (CLEY) letter amexed to your Permit.
- 7. That you comply with Section 36 of the Fisheries Act which requires that no person shall deposit or permit the deposit of a deleterious substance on any type in water frequented by fish or in any place under any conditions where the deleterious substance may enter such a water body.
- 8. That transportation of fuel be done in compliance with the Transportation of Dangerous Goods Act and regulations.
- 9. That you ensure that all fuel is stored and dispensed in accordance with CCME
 Environmental Code of Practice for Above Ground Storage Tank System and The National
 Fire Code Regulations
- 10. The you follow the Camp Sanitation Regulations made under the authority of the Public Health Act of the Northwest Territories.

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31 (1) (a) - Location and Area

1. The Permittee shall not conduct this land use operation on any lands not designated in the accepted application, unless otherwise authorized in writing by the Engineer.

PLANS

2. The Permittee shall bury all scrap metal, discarded machinery and parts, barrels and kegs at a site and in a manner designated by a Land Use Inspector in writing.

BURY WASTE MATERIAL

3. The Permittee shall use existing campsite.

CAMP LOCATION

4. The Permittee shall locate all lines, trails and rights-of-way to be constructed parallel to streams a minimum of 30 metres from any stream except at crossings unless otherwise authorized in writing by a Land Use Inspector.

PARALLELING STREAMS

31 (1) (b) - Time

5. The Permittee's Field Supervisor shall contact or meet with a Land Use Inspector at the Iqaluit office of the Department of Indian Affairs and Northern Development, Phone Number (867)979-4405, at least 48 hours prior to the commencement of this land use operation.

CONTACT

The Permittee shall advise a Land Use Inspector at least 10 days prior to the completion of the land use operation of (a) his plan for removal or storage of equipment and materials, and (b) when final clean-up and restoration of the lands used will be completed.

REPORTS BEFORE REMOVAL 7. The Permittee shall notify a Land Use Inspector at least 10 days prior to backfilling any sump.

BACKFILLING NOTIFICATION

8. The Permittee shall complete all clean-up and restoration of the lands used prior to the expiry date of this permit.

CLEAN-UP

9. The Engineer reserves the right to impose closure of any area to the Permittee in periods when dangers to natural resources are severe.

CLOSURE

31 (1) (c) - Equipment

10. The Permittee shall not use any equipment except of the type, size, and number that is listed in the accepted application, unless otherwise authorized in writing by the Land Use Inspector.

ONLY APPROVED EQUIPMENT

11. The Permittee shall use a forced-air fuelfired incinerator to incinerate all combustible garbage and debris. INCINERATORS

12. The Permittee shall keep all garbage and debris in a covered metal container until disposed of.

GARBAGE CONTAINERS

13. The Permittee shall not place dirt or debris into streams to serve as ramps for loading or unloading ships or barges, unless authorized in writing by a Land Use Inspector.

DIRT RAMPS

31 (1) (d) - Methods and Techniques

14. The permittee shall scout proposed lines and routes to select the best location for crossing streams and avoiding terrain obstacles prior to the movement of any vehicle that exerts pressure on the ground in excess of 35 k pa.

15. The Permittee shall slope the sides of excavations and embankments except in solid rock to a horizontal/vertical ratio of 2:1 unless otherwise authorized in writing by the Land Use Inspector.

43. The Permittee shall ensure that fuel FUEL storage containers are not located within BY thirty-one (31) metres of the ordinary high water mark of any body of water unless authorized by the Minister.

The Permittee shall not allow petroleum products to spread to surrounding lands or into water bodies.

FUEL CONTAINMENT

45. The Permittee shall construct a dyke around each stationary fuel container or group of stationary fuel containers where any one container has a capacity exceeding 4.000 litres.

DYKE FUEL CONTAINERS

46. The Permittee shall line the dyke and area enclosed by the dyke with a type of plastic film liner approved by the Engineer.

LINE DYKE

The volume of the dyked area shall be 10% greater than the capacity of the largest fuel container placed therein.

CAPACITY

48. The Permittee shall ensure that the dyke and the area enclosed by the dyke shall be impermeable to petroleum products at all times.
