Dear Natalie Plato:

On April 7, 2011 the Nunavut Impact Review Board (NIRB or Board) received the "PIN-D Ross Point" project proposal from Indian and Northern Affairs Canada-Contaminated Sites' (INAC-Contaminated Sites). On May 9, 2011 the NIRB received a referral for the proposed project from Indian and Northern Affairs Canada-Land Administration and assigned this project proposal file number 11DN029.

The proposed project is located in the Kitikmeot region approximately 186 km northeast of Kugluktuk. The project is proposed to remediate and clean-up the Ross Point site which was reserved by the Department of National Defence in 1956 as well as the PIN-D Intermediate Distant Early Warning (DEW) Line Site which was constructed in 1959 and deactivated in 1963. The program is proposed to take place beginning June 1, 2011 and be completed by December 31, 2012. This proposed project is expected to be completed in conjunction with the previously assessed PIN-E project (NIRB File No. 10DN056).

The project activities include:

- Bring necessary equipment by barge and remove by barge at end of project;
- Establish a 30 person camp;
- Access to site for personnel and supplies by fixed wing aircraft;
- Construct a non-hazardous waste landfill;
- Construct and operate a land farm for hydro contaminated soils;
- Demolish and dispose of previously existing site infrastructure;
- Remove hazardous materials and soils off site to licensed disposal facility;

- Remediate existing landfills/dumps on site;
- Clean- up contaminated soils appropriately;
- Crush and dispose of barrels on or off site depending on contents;

- Collect and dispose of all surface debris;
- Re-construct or repair roads or airstrips as required;
- Develop new borrow sites;
- Store fuel (diesel, gasoline, jet B and propane); and
- Dispose of camp wastes appropriately.

- Whether the project is of a type where the potential adverse effects are highly predictable and mitigable with known technology, (please provide any recommended mitigation measures); and
- Any matter of importance to the Party related to the project proposal.
