A. BACKGROUND

On April 13, 2017 the Nunavut Water Board provided notification to interested parties that Indigenous and Northern Affairs Canada -Contaminated Sites Division(Licensee) had submitted a Type "B" renewal water licence application, # 1BR-SAR0916.

CAM-F Sarcpa Lake was a Distant Early Warning (DEW) Line site and is located on the Melville Peninsula within the Baffin Region; the nearest communities are Hall Beach and Igloolik. CAM-F DEW Line site was constructed in 1957 then abandoned in 1963. In 1977 it was converted into a scientific research station under the Science Institute of the Northwest Territories. It was operated seasonally as a research station by the Department of Indian and Northern Affairs seasonally until 1988.

The Licensee has submitted a renewal application and has requested a renewal water licence term until January 1 2033. The renewed Water Licence would allow for ongoing long-term monitoring activities.

All interested parties were asked to review the Water Licence renewal application and provide technical comments by May 13, 2017.
