General Background Information on the Project (*optional):

CAM-F was an intermediate DEW line site located on the Melville Peninsula, approximately 85 km west of Hall Beach, Nunavut. It was constructed in 1957 and operated until 1963. The site was used as a scientific research station between 1977 and 1988.

The remediation of the site was completed in April 2008. Activities included the demolition and disposal of buildings, structures and other debris, as well as the cleanup of hazardous materials. A non-hazardous waste landfill (NHWL) and secure soil disposal facility (SSDF) were constructed during remediation to contain non-hazardous materials and Tier II contaminated soils, respectively.

As per departmental commitments to monitor the NHWL and SSDF post-closure, a 25-year long term monitoring (LTM) program was initiated at CAM-F in August 2008 and includes visual inspections, groundwater sampling, soil sampling (as required), thermal monitoring (SSDF only), and natural environment monitoring. Refer to the *CAM-F Sarcpa Lake Long Term Monitoring Plan* (2007, 2017) for additional information.

Years 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 7, 10 and 15 of the LTM program were completed in 2008, 2009, 2010, 2011, 2012, 2014, 2017 and 2022 respectively. Future events will occur in 2027, and 2032 (Years 20, and 25 respectively).
