Dear Mr. Beaulieu,

The Department of Indian and Northern Affairs Canada (DIAND) is submitting applications for the remediation of the former CAM-D (Simpson Lake) Intermediate DEW Line Site. Please find enclosed the Water Licence Application (Appendix 1), Exploratory/Remote Camp Supplementary Questionnaire (Appendix 1.1) and supporting documents.

CAM-D (Simpson Lake) is located 80 km west of Kugaaruk and 120 km southeast of Taloyoak. Due to the fact that the regional Land Use Plan has not been developed, a Nunavut Planning Commission conformity check will not be required. In addition to applying for a Water License, DIAND is also applying for a Land Use Permit and an application to access Inuit Owned Land through the Kitikmeot Inuit Association.

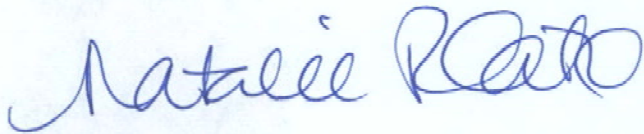
