The following works and activities have been proposed in the above-noted project proposal:

1. **Primary Land Use:** Site Cleanup/Remediation
2. **Project summary description:** Crown-Indigenous and Northern Affairs Canada (CIRNAC) plans to remediate seven abandoned sites on Crown land in the Kitikmeot region of Nunavut. The sites, part of the Speers Lake Bundle Project (the "Sites"), are Speers Lake, Impact Lake, Asiak River, Kendall River, Coppermine Area WK199, Coppermine Area WK210, and Tahiapik River. CIRNAC will oversee the project, involving the demolition of structures and the removal of both hazardous and non-hazardous debris from all site locations.
3. Location: Kitikmeot Region; [several sites near the community of Kugluktuk].

The Nunavut Planning Commission (NPC) has determined that this project proposal is outside the area of an applicable regional land use plan. The project proposal requires screening by the Nunavut Impact Review Board (NIRB) because it does not belong to a class of exempt works or activities set out in Schedule 12-1 of the Nunavut Agreement.
