Please see attached. If you have further questions about authorization to use local dump site for camp refuse, please contact Mr. Ron Ladd, SAO for Municipality of Coral Harbour. Also please review my previous email re-camp coordinates below. My position is not negotiable. I am not willing to list coordinates until a few days before camp mobilization. My reason is logical and clear, the harvest operation utilizes wild animals not fenced in nor could be reasonably expected to be in any one location. It is critical for the success of the harvest that the camp be situated in close proximity of high numbers of caribou.
