WATER USE AND WASTE DISPOSAL PERMIT

Pursuant to Article 13 of the Agreement Between the Inuit of the Nunavut Settlement Area and Her Majesty the Queen in right of Canada, the Nunavut Water Board, hereinafter referred to as the Board, hereby grants to Tunnuq Harvest Ltd. authorization to use and dispose of waste in conjunction with the commercial Caribou Harvest near Coral Harbour on Southampton Island, subject to the following the terms and conditions and those outlined in the Federal Land Use Permit No. N98X834.

1. SCOPE:

- 1. Compliance with the terms and conditions of this permit does not absolve the Permittee from responsibility for compliance with all applicable Federal, Territorial and Municipal legislation.
- 2. This permit is issued subject to the conditions contained herein with respect to the taking of water and the deposit of waste of any type in any waters or in any place under any conditions where such waste or any other waste that results from the deposit of such waste may enter any waters.

2. CONDITIONS FOR WATER USE:

- 1. A distance of at least 30 metres must be maintained between the water supply source and the sewage disposal.
- 2. The Permittee shall ensure that the water used for camp consumption meets the *Canadian Drinking Water Quality Guidelines*.
- 3. Water samples for each camp location shall be submitted to the Board for review.

3. CONDITIONS APPLYING TO WASTE DISPOSAL:

- 1. The Permittee shall not discharge or deposit any refuse substance or other waste materials in any body of water, or on the banks thereof, which will impair the quality of the waters of the natural environment.
- 4. The Permittee shall ensure that all sumps, wastes disposal areas and fuel caches be located a minimum of thirty (30) metres form the normal high water mark of any water body, unless otherwise approved by the Board.
- 5. The Permittee shall remove all garbage and debris from the area of the land use operation to an approved disposal site in Coral Harbour.
- 6. All sewage waste shall be collected in honey bags, temporarily stored until frozen a minimum of thirty (30) metres from the normal high water mark of any water body, then transported to the community of Coral Harbour for final disposal in an

approved site.

7. Animal carcasses shall be disposed of on land at least 30 metres from any water body.

3. CONDITIONS APPLYING TO CONTINGENCY PLANNING:

- 1. The Permittee shall not store fuel on the surface ice of streams or lakes except that which is for immediate/daily use.
- 2. All spills of oil, fuel, or other deleterious materials shall be reported immediately to the 24-Hour Spill Line at (867) 920-8130.
- 8. The Permittee shall submit to the Board, within one (1) month of issuance of this permit, a Spill Contingency Plan which addresses, but is not limited to the following:
 - i. Steps that will be taken to report, contain, clean up and dispose of a contaminant in the event of a spill;
 - ii. The type of response equipment and materials available at each camp;
 - iii. The means by which the contingency plan will be activated; and
 - iv. The expected volume of other hazardous materials expected to be stored at the camps such as fuel, oil, waste oil and glycols. If applicable, clean-up and disposal plans should also be developed for these contaminants.
- 3. The Contingency Plan shall be reviewed annually by the Permittee and revised as necessary to reflect changes in operation and technology.

4. CONDITIONS APPLYING TO SITE OPERATIONS:

- 1. The NWB shall be notified of any changes in operating plans or conditions associated with this water use activity. The Board shall be informed thirty (30) days prior to any such change.
- 9. Annually and within thirty (30) days upon expiration of the authorization, the Permittee shall submit to the Nunavut Water Board a summary report of the water use and waste disposal activities, abandonment and restoration of the site, and list of unauthorized spills and follow-up action taken.
- 10. The Permittee shall complete all clean-up and restoration prior to the expiry date of this permit.

GENERAL CONDITIONS FOR THE ADMINISTRATION OF PERMITS ISSUED BY THE NUNAVUT WATER BOARD (NWB)

The following conditions form an integral part of Permit No. NWB4SOU9800:

- 1. At the time of issuance, a copy of the Permit is placed on the Water Register in the NWB Head Office in Gjoa Haven, and is available to the public.
- 2. If the Permittee contemplates the renewal of Permit No. NWB4SOU9800, it is its responsibility to apply to the NWB for renewal its renewal. The past performance of the Permittee, new documentation and information, and issues raised during a public hearing, if the NWB is required to hold one, will be used to determine the terms and conditions of the Permit renewal. Note that if the permit expires before the NWB issues a new one, then water use and waste disposal must cease, or the Permittee will be in contravention of the Nunavut Land Claims Agreement. The NWB recommends that an application for the renewal of Permit No. NWB4SOU9800 be filed at least one month before the Permit's expiry date.
- 3. If Permit No. NWB4SOU9800 requires amendment, then a public hearing may be required. The Permittee should submit applications for amendment as soon as possible to give the NWB sufficient time to go through the amendment process. The process may vary depending on the scope of the amendment requested.
