RE: Nunavut Water Licence NWB2DAR0406 (Boothia Mainland Geoscience Project)

Mr. Ryan,

As no closure inspection appeared in our records, on August 11 2012 AANDC conducted an inspection of the expired NWB2DAR0406 licence. While no activity appears to have occurred at the location given in the licence (N67° 33' 04.8" W92° 40' 40.0"), an alternative camp location was given in the 2006 Annual Report for the Boothia Mainland Geoscience Project (N68° 4' 48.5" W91° 20' 51.4").

At the second location, the area used as an airstrip is still visible. The tent locations are evident by the perimeter stones left in place. The area appears to be heavily used by wildlife; however no garbage, fuel, or items of concern were noted.

The licensee appears to have satisfied the conditions of the licence. I would recommend that the Licensee apply to the Nunavut Water Board for cancellation of the licence.
