Re: Application Acknowledgement for Terrane Metals Corp.'s Renewal Request with Kivalliq Inuit Association for the Maze Lake Project (KVL307C04)

Dear Patrick Lengyel:

On May 24, 2007 the Nunavut Impact Review Board (NIRB or Board) received an application for Access to Inuit Owned Lands for Terrane Metal Corp.'s Maze Lake Project Proposal from the Kivalliq Inuit Association (KIA). The NIRB has assigned this project proposal file number 07EN048.

The original application for the above project was acknowledged by the NIRB on April 26, 2005 and screened in accordance with Part 4, Article 12 of the Nunavut Land Claims Agreement (NLCA). On May 30, 2005 the NIRB issued a 12.4.4(a) screening decision to KIA allowing the proposed exploration to proceed subject to specific terms and conditions.

The NIRB recognizes this is a request for a renewal and that the original project proposal has not changed significantly and there are no new components and activities (pursuant to Sec 12.4.3. NLCA).

Since the request for the renewal does not *significantly* change the general scope of the original project activities, the NIRB is *proposing* to re-issue the same terms and conditions as those in the attached May 30, 2005 Screening Decision Report (attached), along with any new terms and conditions the NIRB feels are appropriate. The NIRB is copying interested Parties and municipalities most affected by this project with this letter, and we invite interested persons to comment directly to the NIRB by **June 26, 2007**.

The NIRB would like Parties to provide comments regarding:

- Whether the project proposal is likely to arouse significant public concern; and if so, why;
- Whether the project proposal is likely to cause significant adverse eco-systemic and socio-economic effects; and if so, why;

- Whether the project is of a type where the potential adverse effects are highly predictable and mitigable with known technology, (please provide any recommended mitigation measures); and
- Any matter of importance to the Party related to the project proposal.
