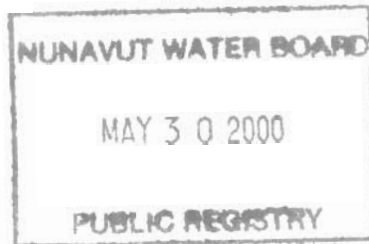

This letter is an addendum to the application for access to IOL Parcel BB 38 76 K/N, regarding our mineral claims PAY 1 and PAY 2 in the Pistol Lake area.

I have received information regarding wildlife habitat in this area from both the Nunavut Wildlife Board, and the Nunavut Planning Commission and felt it would be prudent to pass it on.

The Nunavut Planning Commission conducted a study of the West Kitikmeot area and provided me with some internal maps showing Caribou activity, Musk ox activity, and Human activity in the Bathurst Inlet area. These maps were produced after consulting with the local IITA's.

In terms of caribou activity, our claim group is approximately 30 kilometers east of both the main spring and fall migration routes. There is an identified caribou crossing of the Hood River just northeast of the claim group that could impact upon our operations. Having this identified, it would be prudent to monitor this activity this year to see how many animals use this crossing.


In terms of Musk ox activity, the claim group lies within the identified calving range, albeit at the southern end of the range. Monitoring Musk ox activity during calving time would be prudent also.

There is no regular Human activity in the area.

The most recent Nunavut Wildlife Board information is from a 1975 study. This study shows that caribou, musk ox, wolves, wolverine, and grizzly bear are found throughout the area.

We will be in touch with the Kitikmeot Hunters and Trappers Association to get an updated overview of the wildlife in the area, and will forward the results of their response to you at that time.
