Re: Proposed Barge Docking Site

At a special Council Meeting on Wednesday, June 20/01, Council reviewed the latest design for the Marine Resupply Relocation as prepared by JIVKO Engineering of Yellowknife. It then passed Motion 111/01 approving the site and the proposed development. Both Council and the community are very anxious for this project to proceed as quickly as possible as the present site is far too small and becomes very congested and dangerous with the amount of barge traffic that this community now receives. We are also very anxious for the existing fuel line to be replaced with a new one to the relocated site as this line poses an ongoing hazard through potential leakages and prevents development of many lots in the central part of the community.

We trust that funding will be put in place and approvals obtained for a good portion of the work to be carried out this summer and that the project will be completed in time for the next barge season.

Dear Mr. Jivkov,

Although there are a number of species of fish such as arctic char, caplin, herring, white fish, brown and black cod which at different times of the year inhabits this area, relocating the dock further out into the open bay would consequently minimize the impact on fish than the existing dock which is located at the mouth of the Coppermine River.

At a Kugluktuk Angoniatit Association (HTO) special meeting held June 21, 2001 the Board made a formal Resolution # 190 in support of the proposed project to build a breakwater and dock for the new resupply site. This new facility will have minimum impact on fishing patterns in the area or otherwise affect any community members livelihood or fishing opportunity. The area for the new breakwater and dock is not used for any fishing activity.
