EXERCISE NOTIFICATION LETTER

The purpose of this letter is to provide notification of a large-scale Canadian Armed Forces (CAF) exercise that will take place in the area of Rankin Inlet, Chesterfield Inlet and Whale Cove in the period 3 - 23 February 2014, pursuant to 21.5.13 of the Agreement between the Inuit of the Nunavut Settlement Area and Her Majesty the Queen in Right of Canada:

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This exercise will involve approximately 350 CAF members supported by Canadian Rangers from the Rankin Inlet, Chesterfield Inlet, and Whale Cove Canadian Ranger Patrols. The aim of the exercise is to give the visiting CAF participants experience in operating far from their home base in extreme winter conditions. A small party will arrive to make local preparation on 3 - 4 February 2014. An advance party of approximately 30 members will arrive in Rankin Inlet on 7 - 8 February 2014. Cargo and equipment will arrive in Rankin Inlet commencing 9 February 2014. The main body of approximately 320 CAF personnel will arrive 15 -16 February 2014. Approximately 110 soldiers will conduct patrols and Arctic survival activities in and around the Hamlet of Rankin Inlet. Concurrently, another group of 110 soldiers will be conducting patrol and Arctic survival activities in the Hamlet of Rankin Inlet and will travel to and from Whale Cove and Chesterfield Inlet escorted by Canadian Rangers. They will not cross any Inuit owned lands.

Please note that the dates and details of this event may change slightly due to unpredictable circumstances such as poor weather.
