## Andrew,

Thank you for your inquiry regarding whether a water licence may be required to authorize the following activities associated with the Iqaluit Airport Improvement Project:

- Construct new Air Terminal Building
- Construct new Combined Services Building
- Re-surface/repair/re-construct/re-grade existing runway, taxiways and Aprons
- Construct new taxiways
- Re-align existing drainage ditches
- Replace all airside lighting
- Replace fuel dispensing station
- Provide new air terminal building access and parking
- Provide new roadways
- Provide new water, sewer, power, and communication services to buildings
- Demolish existing structures

Based on the information you have provided to date, it appears that there is no water use or deposit of waste that would trigger the requirement for a water licence under the Nunavut Waters and Nunavut Surface Rights Tribunal Act and the provisions of the Northwest Territories Waters Regulations that continue to apply in Nunavut. Please note that the NWB's conclusion is based solely on the brief description of activities provided and the Board's assumptions that based on these descriptions the proposed activities will NOT result in the direct or indirect deposit of wastes to surface water, nor will the activities result in the impoundment or alteration of flow greater than 2500 cubic metres at the site. If however, these assumptions are incorrect and it is anticipated that the activities would result in the deposit of wastes into surface water or the impoundment or alteration of flow exceeding 2500 m3, please advise the Board, as we would need more detail and may need to reconsider our conclusion on the requirement of a licence.
