## Existing Water Licence # 2BE-KAZ0609

## **Background Information:**

Aurora Energy Resources Inc. applied to the NWB for an assignment of the existing licence from Pacific Ridge Exploration Ltd. on March 23, 2009. The application noted a proposed license/activity duration of June 2009 to October 31, 2011.

## **Recommendations / Comments**

INAC has no specific concerns with the assignment of this particular licence. However, Aurora Resources should be advised that the licence is set to expire September 15, 2009. As per condition Part B, Item 5 of the licence, the NWB recommends that an application for the renewal of the licence be filed at least 3 months before the licence expiry date.

In addition, should the NWB approve the assignment of this licence, Aurora Resources should be advised of section 46 of the *Nunavut Waters, Nunavut Surface Rights Tribunal Act* which states that the expiry of a licence does not relieve the holder from any obligations imposed by the licence. As such, the proponent must note the requirement to restore the site as per Part H, Items 1-15 of the current licence.
