## Land Use Plan - Silvertip Project, Kitikmeot Region, Nunavut

Strongbow Exploration Inc. ("Strongbow") is a Canadian exploration company engaged in the search for economic mineral deposits in Canada. The purpose of Strongbow's activities under this land use application is to continue to evaluate the potential for economic concentrations of minerals in Nunavut.

The Silvertip Project is located in the Kitikmeot Region of Nunavut, approximately 460 km southeast of Kugluktuk and consists of both Inuit Owned Lands and mineral claims located on Crown Lands, totaling approximately 11,300 ha. The area is considered by Strongbow to be prospective for gold and base metal mineralization.

The proposed exploration program for the 2007 season will be conducted over approximately 12 -16 weeks through the months of June to September (weather pemitting). Work to be conducted may include prospecting, mapping, soil sampling, ground geophysics and the drilling of land based targets. Should results warrant it a program of similar timing, size and scope may also occur in 2008.

Field crews will be working from a small, temporary camp designed to accommodate 10 to 12 people at a time, for an approximate period of 12 to 16 weeks. Personnel will vary in number and job description but typically will consist of 1 drill foreman, 4 drillers, 1 helicopter pilot, 1 helicopter engineer, 2-4 geologists, and 1 cook/first aid attendant.

Fixed wing support for the camp will be variable and temporary, utilizing a Twin Otter aircraft (equipped with floats) for the movement of personnel, supplies and equipment. A Hughes 500D Helicopter (or similar machine) will transport field and drilling crews to their work/sampling areas and will remain on site with the personnel for emergency support. Concerns raised by communities in the north with regard to flight altitude and wildlife will be respected.

At the end of the proposed program, all camps materials, fuel drums, etc. will be removed from the site. All garbage will be incinerated at the site, with non-combustible garbage (scrap metal etc.) collected and removed. Once the clean up is complete, there will be no remaining evidence of the camp.

Strongbow and our partners conduct extensive exploration programs within Nunavut and the Northwest Territories. We recognize the importance of our role in discovering mineral deposits and that our exploration programs must be conducted in the most socially and environmentally responsible fashion possible.
