Re: Notice of Additional Information and Comment Period Extension for Golden Bull
Resources Corporation's SLAVE Contwoyto Lake – Hood River Project Proposal

Dear Mr. Goad:

On September 19, 2007, the Nunavut Impact Review Board (NIRB or Board) received Golden Bull Resources Corporation's (GBR) SLAVE Contwoyto Lake – Hood River project proposal from the Kitikmeot Inuit Association (KIA). The NIRB assigned this project proposal file number 07EN067. In correspondence of September 21, 2007 to you, the NIRB copied interested Parties and municipalities most likely to be affected by GBR's project proposal, and requested comments from these Parties by October 12, 2007.

On September 28, 2007, the NIRB received an additional application from Indian and Northern Affairs Canada (INAC) which indicated that GBR is planning an on-ice drilling program to commence in January 2009. The initial application indicated the *potential* to perform on land and/or ice drilling (emphasis added). The scope of the project activities now include on-ice drilling on Crown Lands, with 3-5 drill sites located on the East Arm of Contwoyto Lake.

The NIRB is copying interested Parties and municipalities most affected by GBR's change in project activities with this letter.

Due to the additional information received, the NIRB is **extending the comment period**, and we invite interested persons to comment directly to the NIRB by **October 19, 2007**.

NIRB would like Parties to provide comments regarding:

- Whether the project proposal is likely to arouse significant public concern; and if so, why;
- Whether the project proposal is likely to cause significant adverse eco-systemic and socioeconomic effects; and if so, why;

- Whether the project is of a type where the potential adverse effects are highly predictable and mitigable with known technology, (please provide any recommended mitigation measures); and
- Any matter of importance to the Party related to the project proposal.
