Hi Deborah,

Thanks for re-sending. I was travelling in April and failed to keep a copy of that e-mail.

As a general rule, I will not recommend closure/cancellation of Water Licences based on past Land Use Permit closures.

The fact remains that no coordinates for the activities undertaken have been submitted. While the likelihood of a significant impact from these activities is low, it is not at my discretion to waive an inspection of the activity. I unfortunately do not have access to the final plan submitted to Lands, as the file has already been archived. If you submit coordinates for the till sampling I will add it to my inspection list. Otherwise, it is at the discretion of the Board whether they feel the licence can be closed or canceled based on current understanding of the file.

"Hi Eva:

RE: Water License: 2BE-TIM0813

Diamondex/Canterra did not establish a camp in the Ellice Hills region. The exploration program consisted of basal till sampling and operations were carried out from Kugaaruk. Also, drilling was not undertaken in the area and fuel caches were not established. The co-ordinates for the Land Use Permit are given as; N67° 45', W89° 30'. Attached is Baba Pederson's Field Inspection Report and subsequent Inspection letter that recommends the closure of the LUP. Canterra's impact as related to Water License: 2BE-TIM0813 and LUP: N2006C0016 has been negligible and we request that these files be closed.

Hi Deborah,

I don't mean to be repetitive, and while I'm sure it appears otherwise, I am not trying to make this difficult. I am requesting specific information related to a water licence, in accordance with the powers of inspection accorded to me by designation under the *Nunavut Waters and Nunavut Surface Rights Tribunal Act*.

I am aware of the LUP coordinate. What I seek is information to support *whether or not this coordinate accurately represents where the activity took place*. No such information was provided in the water licence documentation. Here is the issue with LUP locations: Unless a camp location or other detailed information is provided in the LUP application, this coordinate is often an arbitrary point chosen by our Lands Administration staff to represent the LUP. As such, it tends to be a very general coordinate, given in degrees and minutes, not seconds. That represents a lot of land that is not easy to inspect. The coordinate is generally updated after activity has taken place, when the company sends more information on where they conducted their work (or located their camp etc.). I do not have access to the LUP information as it has been archived. You may submit that documentation to me if you feel it would be helpful. However, at this time, given that the LUP coordinate shows only degrees and minutes, it reinforces my view that this is likely an arbitrary and thus meaningless coordinate. I am requesting that you submit a document that shows precisely where the work was conducted. I would assume that if till samples were taken, that some kind of GPS coordinates would be recorded at the sample locations for future record?

If this information does not exist, please just tell me so and we will deal with that issue.
