General Background Information on the Project (*optional):

Strongbow Exploration Inc. undertook a small exploration program on their prospecting permits covering Wales Island (NTS: 47B/03, 47M/15, 16) in August of 2005. The program consisted of drilling 8 geophysical targets, ground geophysics on additional geophysical targets and till sampling.

The 2005 exploration program was conducted from August 4th to September 10th, 2005 and project personnel included one geologist, four drillers, one helicopter pilot, one helicopter engineer, two geophysicists, one cook/first aid attendant and one bear safety officer. A temporary exploration camp consisting of six tents (3 sleepers, 1 office, 1 kitchen, and 1 dry) was established at a southern location on Wales Island.

Water for domestic use was pumped daily into a holding tank from a lake adjacent to the camp (see coordinates provided above for camp water source). All drill cuttings were contained in the area of the collar by natural depressions. Throughout the occupation of the camp runoff from the dry was absorbed by the ground. No garbage was burned on site. All refuse was backhauled to Igloolik.

All drill set-ups were cleaned up and the surrounding area restored as per the project's Abandonment and Restoration Plan. Anchors were cut as close as possible to the ground, and cuttings were contained in the area of the collar by natural depressions. Upon closure of the camp for the winter the outhouse was backfilled with gravel/dirt, the kitchen sump was cleaned of food debris, and all water drained into the gravel. Throughout the occupation of the camp runoff from the dry was absorbed by the ground. No garbage was burned on site. All refuse was backhauled to Igloolik.

Future occupation of this camp site and work on these landholdings is contingent upon results.
