Re: Notice of Part 4 Screening for Charles Jefferson's "Geomapping for Energy and Minerals" project proposal

Dear Charles Jefferson:

On April 27, 2009 the Nunavut Impact Review Board (NIRB or Board) received the Geological Survey of Canada – Charles Jefferson's (GSC) "Geomapping for Energy and Mapping Program" project proposal from the Kivalliq Inuit Association. On May 26, 2009 the NIRB received a positive conformity determination (Keewatin Regional Land Use Plan) from the Nunavut Planning Commission. NIRB has assigned this project proposal file number **09YN042** – please reference this number in all future related correspondence.

The project is located in the Thelon Basin (outside of the Thelon Game sanctuary) near Baker Lake. The program is proposed to take place from July 1, 2009 to August 31, 2011.

The project activities include:

- Low level airborne survey to obtain geophysical data, July 15 to August 30 in Areas 5, 6, 1-2-3
- On foot geological survey
- Primary accommodations in Baker Lake and existing industry camp sites
- Some geological work using small portable tents for field crews of 2-3 that will be set out as fly camps for up to 7 days, carrying 10L gasoline, and 20L propane
- Transport using fixed wing aircraft, aircraft on floats, or helicopters operating out of Baker Lake
- Planning consultation coordinated with Baker Lake and Rankin Inlet, and Government of Nunavut caribou biologist, Mitch Campbell with specific focus on scheduling flights for minimum impact on caribou calving

- Whether the project proposal is likely to cause significant adverse eco-systemic and socioeconomic effects; and if so, why;
- Whether the project is of a type where the potential adverse effects are highly predictable and mitigable with known technology, (please provide any recommended mitigation measures); and
- Any matter of importance to the Party related to the project proposal.
