Roles and responsibilities

Crown-Indigenous Relations and Northern Affairs Canada's (CIRNAC) responsibilities, mandate, and obligations stem from the following:

- *Department of Indian Affairs and Northern Development Act*
- Nunavut Agreement
- *Nunavut Land Claims Agreement Act*
- *Nunavut Waters and Nunavut Surface Rights Tribunal Act* and the associated regulations
- *Nunavut Planning and Project Assessment Act*
- *Territorial Lands Act* and the associated regulations
- *Arctic Waters Pollution Prevention Act*





Contributions to the application review

CIRNAC made the following submissions to the Nunavut Water Board:

1. February 14, 2018 – Preliminary completeness review
2. March 29, 2018 – Technical review
3. September 28, 2018 – Final written submission

1. Scope and terms of licences

- Two type A licences:
 - Doris-Madrid
 - Boston
- CIRNAC recommends type B bulk sample licences be integrated into type A licences
- We support a licence term that matches project schedule





2. Water supply and management

- Doris-Madrid:
 - Windy Lake as potable water source
 - Doris Lake as industrial water source
 - Water managed in Tailings Impoundment Area (TIA)
- Boston:
 - Aimaokatalok Lake as water source
 - Water managed in surge pond



3. Waste management

- Non-hazardous waste incinerated or in on-site landfills
- Hazardous waste shipped off-site
- Tailings
 - Doris-Madrid: sub-area deposition in TIA
 - Boston: filtered and stacked in TMA





4. Management plans

- Doris-Madrid: 17 plans
- Boston: 19 plans
- TMAC committed to updating
 - Doris-Madrid Water Management Plan for process water treatment plant
 - Non-hazardous Waste Management Plan prior to building landfills
- CIRNAC recommends incorporating plan updates in licences, explicitly stating changes cannot be undertaken before plans are approved





5. Monitoring programs

- New stations for Surveillance Network Programs
- Aquatic Effects Monitoring Plan





6. Closure and reclamation

- Closure and reclamation plans
- Reclamation cost estimates
- Division of security between Kitikmeot Inuit Association and CIRNAC
- Phases for posting security
- CIRNAC seeks an agreement on the amount and division of security and recommends fewer phases for posting security
