The NIRB's goal from this consultation is to identify Valued Ecosystem Components (VECs) and Valued Socio-Economic Components (VSECs) that should be addressed in the Proponent's *Draft* Environmental Impact Statement (EIS). The public scoping meetings will include the following discussions:

- Explain the NIRB's Review process, including how members of the public may participate;
- Inform the public of the proposed Back River project under Review; and,
- Work with members of the public to identify Valued Ecosystem Components (VECs) and Valued Socio-Economic Components (VSECs) that should be considered in the NIRB's Review of the Back River project.
