Dear Ms. Prather and Ms. Range:

Further to the Nunavut Water Board (NWB or Board) correspondence<sup>1</sup>, dated February 3, 2026, with respect to the determination of completeness of the 2AM-DOH1335 Water Licence Amendment Application and supporting documentation (Application) submitted by Agnico Eagle Mines Limited (Agnico Eagle or Applicant) for the Doris-Madrid (Hope Bay) Project, the Board received, on or before March 20, 2026, the Information Requests (IRs) and recommendations from the Kitikmeot Inuit Association (KIA), Crown-Indigenous Relations and Northern Affairs (CIRNA), Environment and Climate Change Canada (ECCC) and Fisheries and Oceans Canada (DFO). The original deadline for submissions was March 5, 2026, which was extended to March 19, 2026 after an extension request by the KIA.

On April 9, 2026, the Applicant provided their responses to the parties' IRs and recommendations on the completeness of the Application. Intervenors were requested to confirm by April 20, 2026, whether the Applicant's responses were satisfactory. ECCC responded on April 17, 2026, that they had no further concerns and were ready to move to the Technical Review stage. The KIA, CIRNA and DFO submitted follow-up requests by April 21, 2026. Agnico Eagle responded to the second round of submissions from the KIA, CIRNA and DFO on April 24, 2026.

Notice of Application and Commencement of Technical Review

---

After reviewing all submissions from Interveners and responses from Agnico Eagle, the NWB notes that there are some outstanding concerns from the KIA, CIRNA and DFO. The Board is of the opinion that some of these concerns are not necessarily information requests, but rather technical issues that could be more effectively discussed during the Technical Review stage and the in-person Technical Meeting and Pre-Hearing Conference (TM-PHC).

Addressing these outstanding technical issues at that stage would help move the review process forward more efficiently. Further, the NWB reminds parties that it was seeking feedback on the completeness of information required to begin the full technical review stage, where technical issues can be examined in greater detail.

Copies of the comments received from Intervening parties, submissions from the Applicant, and all documents associated with the Application have been placed in the Board's online Public Registry and can be accessed via the following link:

Based on the scope and nature of Undertaking, the Application has been deemed to be a complete application for a type A Water Licence. As such, it will require a public hearing as required by the *Nunavut Waters and Nunavut Surface Rights Tribunal Act (NWNSRTA)*. All public hearing matters will be carried out in accordance with the Board's *Rules of Practice and Procedure for Public Hearing* dated May 11, 2005 (NWB Rules).

### **NWB Notice of Application and Commencement of Technical Review**

The NWB has determined through the completeness and preliminary assessment, which took into consideration the Application, Interveners' submissions, and the Board's initial review, that the Application submitted by Agnico Eagle generally constitutes an administratively and materially complete Application in accordance with the Guides<sup>2</sup>. The Board has therefore decided that the Application can proceed to the next stage(s) of the licensing process, subject to any outstanding pre-licensing considerations that may be associated with the Application. The NWB retains the rights, however, to request additional information and studies pursuant to s. 48(2) of the *NWNSRTA* or to issue additional guidelines for the provision of information pursuant to s. 48(3) of the *NWNSRTA*, if it becomes necessary.

In accordance with s. 55(1) of the *NWNSRTA*, the **Board gives notice of the Application** and invites interested persons to make representation to the Board no later than **June 1, 2026** (3:00 p.m. MST). Notice of the Application will also be forwarded to the council of each municipality in the area(s) most affected by the Application and shall be published in a newspaper of general circulation in the area(s) affected or, if there is no such newspaper, in such other manner as the Board considers appropriate. Parties are advised that the consequences of failure to respond are outlined in s. 59 and s. 60(2) of the *NWNSRTA*<sup>3</sup>.

The next steps in the Board’s consideration of the Application have been outlined as follows for the information of all parties. Please note that the Board reserves the right to revise the next steps and timelines if circumstances dictate:

**Steps Preceding Technical Meeting**

<b>April 30, 2026</b>	Commencement of the technical review period; parties are asked to provide their technical review comments to the Board
<b>June 1, 2026</b>	Submission of technical review comments and representations to the Board.
<b>June 16, 2026</b>	Applicant to provide response(s) to technical review comments. Parties given an opportunity to review responses from Applicant.
<b>June 23, 2026</b>	Circulation of draft Agenda.
<b>June 29, 2026</b>	Submission of Applicant’s and Interveners’ presentations for the proposed technical meeting (including translated versions). Confirmation of attendance and receipt of draft agenda.
<b>July 2, 2026</b>	Circulation of final agenda for the Technical Meeting / Pre-Hearing Conference.

**Steps including and following Technical Meeting**

**1. Technical Meeting / Pre-Hearing Conference: July 6-7, 2026**

Rule 14 of the NWB Rules permits the Board, through its staff or in conjunction with staff, to hold a Technical Meeting (TM) and Pre-hearing Conference (PHC) with interested parties, either in writing, by teleconference, or in person.

Section 60(2) Subsection (1) does not apply in respect of a person referred to in that subsection who fails to respond to the notice of application given under subsection 55(1) within the time period specified in that notice for making representations to the Board.

The Board has directed the staff of the NWB, in accordance with the NWB Rules, to hold an in-person TM/PHC in **Cambridge Bay** in the week of **July 6, 2026** (tentatively on **July 6-7, 2026**). Interested persons should note that these dates are tentative and could be changed by the Board with a notice provided to parties. In advance of the date on which the TM/PHC will be held, the NWB will issue correspondence that will confirm dates and provide other relevant details.

## 2. Pre-Hearing Conference (PHC) Decision

Following the TM/PHC, the NWB will issue a PHC decision that may outline the technical commitments of the Applicant and the administrative and procedural requirements for a Public Hearing.

### Public Hearing (PH) Notice

Sub-section 55(2) of the *NWNSRTA* requires that a minimum notice period of sixty (60) days be provided for a Public Hearing (PH). As with the Technical Meeting / Pre-hearing Conference, the Board has the ability to conduct its Public Hearing in writing, by teleconference, or in person. Once the Board has received all information requested through this process and is satisfied that the Public Hearing should proceed, the type or place, date, and time of the hearing will be determined, and a notice will be published by the Board in advance of the Public Hearing and in a manner that promotes public awareness and participation in the hearing.

## 3. Public Hearing Decision

Following the Public Hearing (PH), the Board will issue a final written decision with reasons (final decision). The final decision will be provided to the Minister of the Northern Affairs (Minister) for the Minister's decision. Interested and intervening parties will also be provided with a copy of the Board's final decision as well as the Minister's decision.

Throughout the technical review phase, interested parties are encouraged to work cooperatively with Agnico Eagle to discuss issues in advance of the proposed TM/PHC. The NWB, however, requests to be kept informed of any issues and any agreements reached between the parties on specific issues related to the Application. The Board also asks that all technical review comments, particularly for matters such as marine discharges, air quality, noise, and wildlife, be provided within the limits of the NWB's jurisdiction over the use of Waters and the deposit of Waste in Waters or that may enter Waters.
