Thank you for the invitation to provide comments regarding TMAC's responses to comments received regarding the Hope Bay Project 2019 Annual Report review.

I have just returned from leave, so I missed the deadline for comments on August 25. Crown-Indigenous Relations and Northern Affairs Canada (CRINAC) has reviewed TMAC's responses to CIRNAC comments and would like to inform the Nunavut Water Board and TMAC that CIRNAC no concerns with the responses and considers CIRNAC concerns resolved.

CIRNAC would like to note that in the response to CIRNAC-2: Management of Cyanide Concentrations, TMAC has indicated that "TMAC is in the process of evaluating what cyanide concentration management looks like in the future, based on the predictions from the updated mine plan, production rates and

reagent use." CIRNAC is interested to know how and when the results of this evaluation will be presented, and requests that TMAC follow up with CIRNAC when the evaluation has been completed and a management strategy for cyanide concentrations has been selected.
