Request Made by Interested Party:

CIRNAC recommends that Agnico Eagle provide justification for when items will be placed in the non-hazardous land fill and the methodology to be used when determining what items will be transported off site to a licensed facility.

Agnico Eagle's Response to Request:

Only non-salvageable waste will be placed in the landfill. Landfills on site are a normal approved facility for construction, operations and closure.

Request Made by Interested Party:

Restates the recommendation and further, for clarity, Non-salvageable waste is not a defined term. CIRNAC simply seeks clarity of process and would ask that to be provided.

CIRNAC has no additional recommendations to the board.

Agnico Eagle's Response to Request:

Economically non-salvageable is defined as non-hazardous, non-putrescible solid wastes from the construction, operation, and closure of the Hope Bay Mine that has negative monetary value when shipped South for recycling.

Criteria for determining its value would include:

- Demand for a particular recyclable material in the South, and
- · Cost of material handling and shipping.

Re:	Detailed Description of Construction		

Request Made by Interested Party:

The current management plan does not include a detailed description of any construction required to develop the landfill. DFO requests the proponent provide a construction plan for the development of the landfill and provide a blast monitoring plan if any blasting will take place near fish bearing water.

Agnico Eagle's Response to Request:

The landfill will be developed in a pre-developed quarry and there will be no blasting near fish bearing water. A run of quarry rockfill berm will be constructed downstream of the landfill. Standard equipment will be used and will include 745 Haul Trucks, a 349 Excavator, D8 Dozer, and a 988 Loader. Since the landfill will be constructed in a developed quarry, disturbance will be minimal.

Response Made by Interested Party:

As per the clarification provided by The Department of Fisheries and Oceans Canada (DFO) to the NWB on March 21st, 2025, DFO has confirmed that Agnico Eagle has addressed their comments.
