Dear Mr. Kabloona:

Thank you for your letter received September 20, 2007, conveying water licence no. 2AM-DOH0713 for the Doris North Gold Mine Project, and the Nunavut Water Board's reasons for decision. I thank the Nunavut Water Board for its work in the development of this licence.

I have approved the licence effective immediately and a signed copy is enclosed. A copy of this letter is being sent to the project proponent, Miramar Hope Bay Ltd. and to the Ikitikmeot Inuit Association, the designated Inuit organization, to inform them of my approval of the project's water licence as required by the Nunavut Waters and Nunavut Surface Rights Tribunal Act. I have also instructed the Nunavut regional office of Indian and Northern Affairs Canada to consult with Miramar on the form and posting of security in the amount of \$11.714 million to be held by the Government of Canada in accordance with section 70 of the Act and section 12(3) of the Regulations.

The issue and amount of security was an important concern in my consideration of this licence. You received written submissions from departmental officials (August 24, 2007) which dealt with my authority to hold and apply water licence security. Under the legislative framework for water licensing in Nunavut, the Government of Canada cannot hold security, nor can I draw against the Board ordered security, for any purpose other than those specifically authorized in the Act.

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Canada

I recognize the challenge of anticipating the costs of reclamation for resource development projects like the Doris North gold mine. It is possible that the landowner may seek from the proponent an additional reclamation bond. Officials from Indian and Northern Affairs Canada will be pleased to participate in any discussions of reclamation security and welcome opportunities to work with proponents, landowners, and the Board on this issue so critical to sustainable development in Nunavut.

I thank the Water Board again for its efforts and energies in the development of the Doris North project's water licence and look forward to the economic benefits this mine will bring to the people of Nunavut.
