As previously announced, the staff of the Nunavut Impact Review Board (NIRB) will be hosting an Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) Guidelines development workshop at the Community Centre in Baker Lake on March 22-24, 2011, as part of the NIRB's review of AREVA Resources Canada Inc.'s (the Proponent) "Kiggavik" project proposal. The objective of this workshop is to bring together parties with jurisdictional authority over the proposed project and/or with technical expertise to offer, to assist the NIRB in finalizing the *Revised Draft* Guidelines for the Proponent's preparation of the EIS for this review.
