Dear Mr. Downey:

Further to the Nunavut Water Board's (NWB or Board) August 21, 2014 correspondence<sup>1</sup> in which interested persons/parties were informed of the rescheduled dates for the Technical Meeting/Pre-Hearing Conference (TM/PHC) and extended technical review period for Lupin Mines Incorporated's (LMI or the Licensee) Type "A" Water Licence (2AM-LUP0914) renewal application (Application), the NWB has received, before the September 19, 2014 extended deadline, submissions from three (3) intervening parties:

- Aboriginal Affairs and Northern Development Canada (AANDC);
- Environment Canada (EC): and
- the Kitikmeot Inuit Association (KIA).

Based on the submissions received, none of the intervening parties have expressed objections to the Application proceeding to the next stage(s) of the licensing process. Therefore, as indicated in previous correspondences, the Technical Meeting/Pre-Hearing Conference (TM/PHC), which has been rescheduled to October 22 - 23, 2014 in the community of Kugluktuk, will proceed as expected.

In accordance with the requirements of the licensing process, Licensee is advised that it <u>must</u> provide its response(s) to interveners' submissions by <u>October 10, 2014</u> to allow ample time for interveners and the Board to review the response(s) in advance of the TM/PHC.

In preparation for the TM/PHC, the Board has attached a copy of the draft agenda and requests that interested persons provide their comments to the NWB's Manager of Licensing at <a href="licensing@nwb-oen.ca">licensing@nwb-oen.ca</a> before <a href="mailto:4:00 p.m. MT">4:00 p.m. MT</a>, October 10, 2014. In addition to comments on the agenda, intervening parties are asked to confirm the names of their representatives who will be participating in the TM/PHC so as to ensure adequate preparations are made. The NWB will provide to interested persons a final version of the agenda and list of participants in advance of the TM/PHC.

Although the TM/PHC is approximately three weeks away, the NWB takes this opportunity to inform the Licensee and intervening parties, intending to make representations, that the Board would require, before <u>4:00 p.m. MST October 15, 2014</u>, copies of their presentations, in English along with Inuktitut summaries, for the TM/PHC and Community Session(s) (PDF/PowerPoint, less than 3 MB/file). It should be noted that the presentation for the Community Session(s) is typically a condensed version of the one for the Technical Meeting.

As the dates for the TM/PHC associated with Licence 2AM-LUP0914 draw closer, the NWB will accordingly keep interested persons informed so as to promote and encourage full participation.
